

Buttercup Family (Ranunculaceae)

- **Common Buttercup (*Ranunculus acris*)**





- **Goldthread (*Coptis trifolia*)**



Goldthread is a perennial wildflower that grows in moist woods and bogs. It has small, white flowers with four to six petals and a central boss of numerous stamens. The leaves are divided into three leaflets and arranged in a basal rosette. The plant blooms from April to June.

Aster Family (Asteraceae)

- **Common Daisy (*Bellis perennis*)**



The common daisy is a perennial wildflower that grows in meadows, lawns, and roadsides. It has small, white flowers with a yellow center. The leaves are simple and arranged in a basal rosette. The plant blooms from March to October.

- **Purple Coneflower (*Echinacea purpurea*)**



The purple coneflower is a perennial wildflower that grows in prairies and open woods. It has large, purple flowers with a central boss of numerous stamens. The leaves are simple and arranged in a basal rosette. The plant blooms from June to September.


- **Black-eyed Susan (*Rudbeckia hirta*)**

- **Canada Lily (*Lilium canadense*)**




The Canada lily is a perennial wildflower that grows in moist woods and meadows. It has large, showy flowers with six petals and a central boss of numerous stamens. The




