
An Oral History Of Conflict From The 1979 Insurrection To The Present



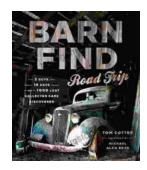

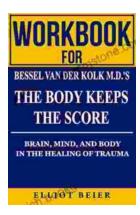
