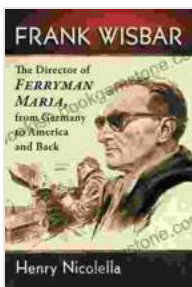


The Director of Ferryman: Maria from Germany to America and Back

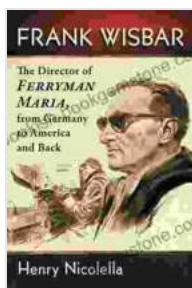

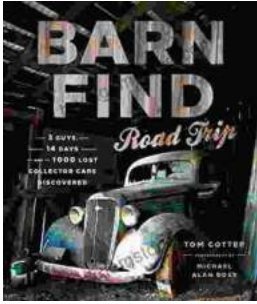

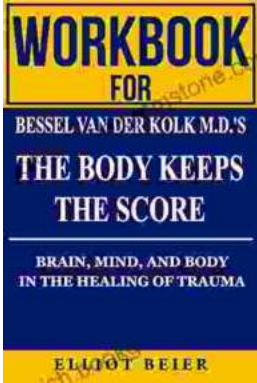
