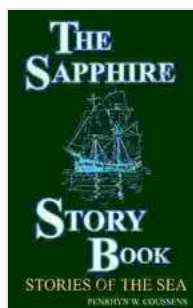

The Lost City

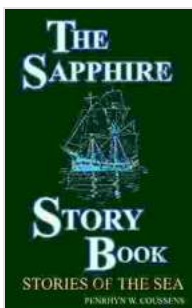

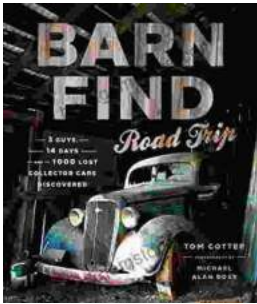

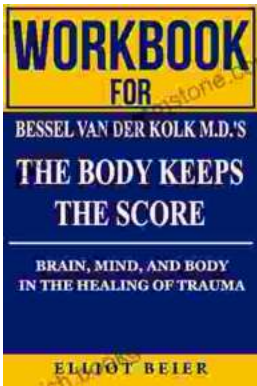
